NEW BUSINESS

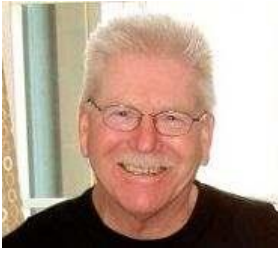
- 1. Event dates for 2014 are to be set at the October meeting.**
