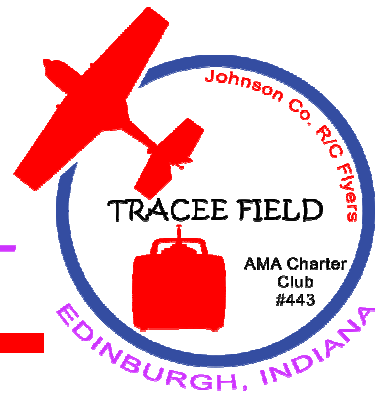

**OLD BUSINESS**

1. A mowing list was posted at the field and several members have signed up to help mow. There is also a map showing where to mow for the first timers. Steve Maxwell suggested that we establish a sign-up list on the club website and he and Denny agreed to work on that.
2. We have a new member to the club Kenny Butz. He is getting back into RC after a 20-year break and has also gotten his son into it as well. Welcome.
